Me and my Bible

Passage Psalm 27

Step 1: Content

List out the facts in 10-20 statements

<u>27:1a</u>	The Lord is my light and my salvation, whom shall I fear
<u>27:1b</u>	The Lord is the defense of my life: whom shall I dread
27:2	When evildoers, my adversaries and enemies, came upon me to devour my flesh, they stumbled/fell
27:3a	Though a host encamp against me, my heart will not fear
27:3b	Though war break out against me, in spite of this I shall be confident
27:4	I have asked the Lord one thing and that is what I will seek – to dwell in His house and all my life and
	behold His beauty and meditate in His temple
27:5	In the day of trouble He will hide me in His tabernacle and tent and lift me up upon a rock
27:6a	And then my head will be lifted up above my enemies around me
27:6b	And I will offer shouts and sacrifices and praises of joy in His tent
27:7	Hear me and answer me when I cry O God
27:8	When You told me to seek Your face, I said that I will do it
27:9	Do not hide Your face from me, or turn away in anger or forsake me, because You are my salvation
27:10	My father and mother have forsaken me but I know that You will take me up
27:11	Teach me Your way and lead me in a level path, because of my foes
27:12a	Don't deliver me over to the desire of my adversaries
27:12b	False witnesses have risen against me and they are breathing out violence
27:13	I would despair if I didn't believe that I would see Your goodness in the land of the living
27:14a	Wait for the Lord
27:14b	Be strong and let your heart take courage

Step 2: Divisions – Summarizing the Facts

Create 2-4 Division Statements to summarize the facts of the passage

I. 27:1-3 David declares his confidence in the Lord

II. 27:4-6 David expresses his desire for God's good presence and protection

III 27:7-12 David cries out in desperation for God

IV 27:13-14 David expresses his belief in the goodness of God and the courage to wait for it

Step 3: Subject Sentence

Use the facts to describe the entire passage in one sentence no more than 12 words long David processes through confidence and desperation for God's goodness and protection.

Step 4: Heart

Consider all the facts to determine the heart of the passage. Write it in one sentence beginning with "To cause the learner to..."

To cause the learner to look to God's goodness of light, protection, presence and salvation during times of trouble.

Step 5: Specific Application Questions and Ponderings

Create questions and ponderings based on each division (step 2) to help you apply the passage to real life

How important is it for me to make these decisions about my "vision" ahead of time? Why?

Psalm 27:4-6 Read verses 4-6.

If I was only allowed to ask the Lord for one thing, what would it be?

Do I think that David had seen the beauty of the Lord before? Why or why not?

<u>Psalm 27:7-12</u> Read verses 7-12.

In what ways am I crying out in desperation to the Lord?

In what ways am I crying out in desperation to other sources of help?

<u>Psalm 27:13-14</u> Read verses 13-14.

Is there any area of my life where I may be questioning God's goodness?

How can believing in God's goodness protect me from despair and depression?

How am I allowing my heart to take courage?

How do verses 13-14 compare with II Corinthians 4:16-18? Explain my answer.
